OBDII Test: requires gasoline powered vehicles to have 'Supported' O2 and Catalytic Converter monitors or will fail test

Mileage Exemptions:

- Allowed for cars within two years of model year if documented to state as being driven less than 40,000 miles at time of first biennial emissions inspection required for registration.
- Allowed for cars of any age if documented to state as being driven less than 12,000 miles between required biennial emissions inspections for registration.

Cost-Based Repair Waivers:

- \$450 spent on qualified parts and labor if work done by Missouri Recognized Repair Technician (MRRT) who has and maintain current A6, A8 and L1 ASE certifications. Shop registers with state to be on MRRT list.
- \$450 in qualified parts alone if done at non-MRRT shop
- \$400 in EPA qualified parts if owner does repair themselves

Financial Repair Waiver:

• \$200 mimimum in qualified repairs required. Allowed when vehicle owner is on state or federal disability

Estimate Based Waiver:

 Inspection reports a single DTC, for which a written diagnosis is obtained and estimate of repair exceeds \$450 in total cost. It is a onetime waiver, vehicle must have DTC corrected for at next inspection for registration.

Repair:

May be performed by anyone. Qualified repairs must be made, and are considered those supported by diagnostic data as causing the DTC or test failure. Qualified repairs are expected to prevent DTC from being reported on post-repair inspection.
